- School centred training, delivered by teachers, in partnership with Northumbria university.
- 1 year post graduate training brings PGCE equivalent with qualified teacher status.
- Jobs are often achieved in the group of schools who delivered the training.

- Schools with outstanding behaviour, which can focus on teaching.
- Training and mentoring by outstanding teachers, with a range of specialisms.
