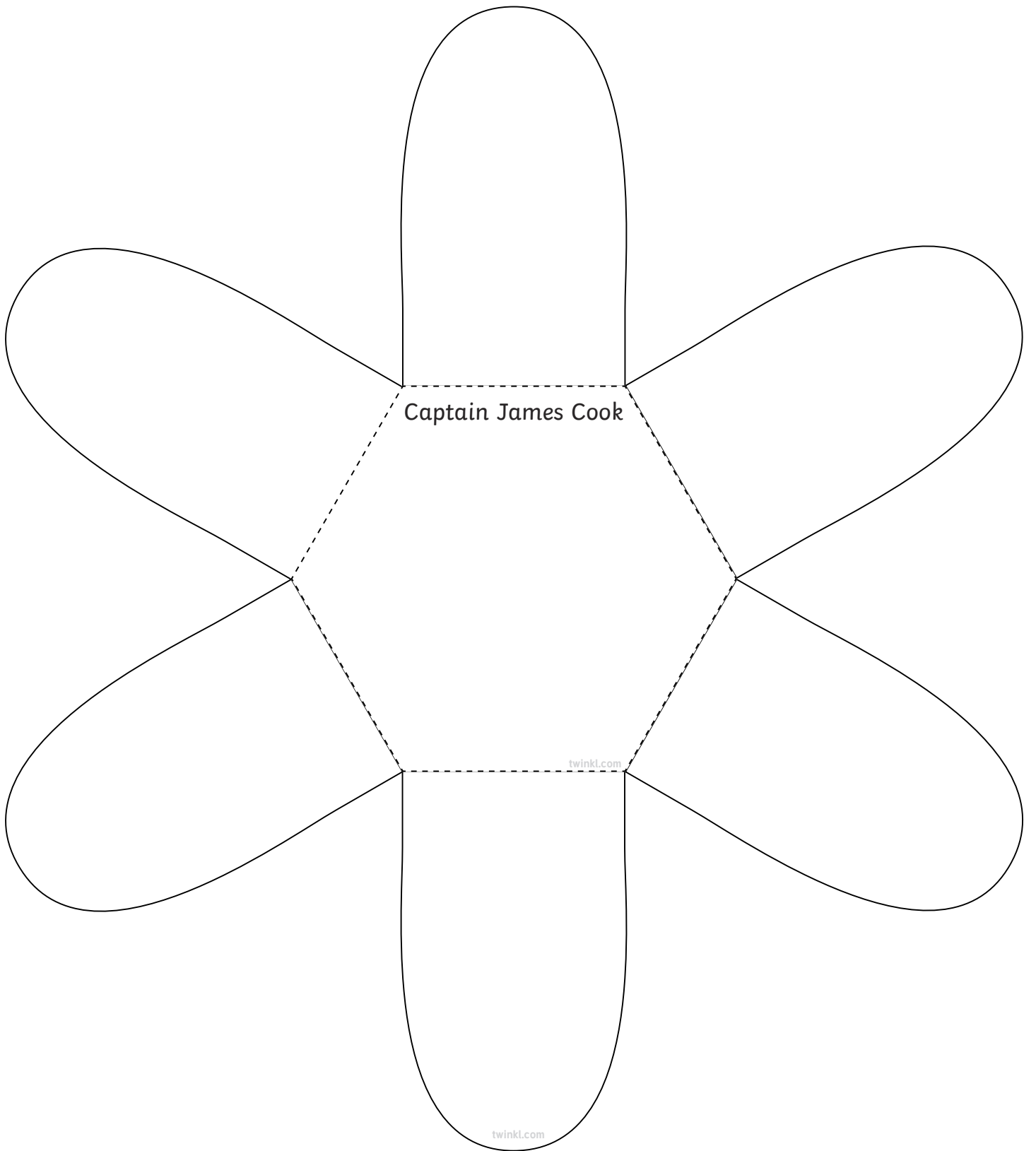




Captain James Cook Fact Flapbooks
